

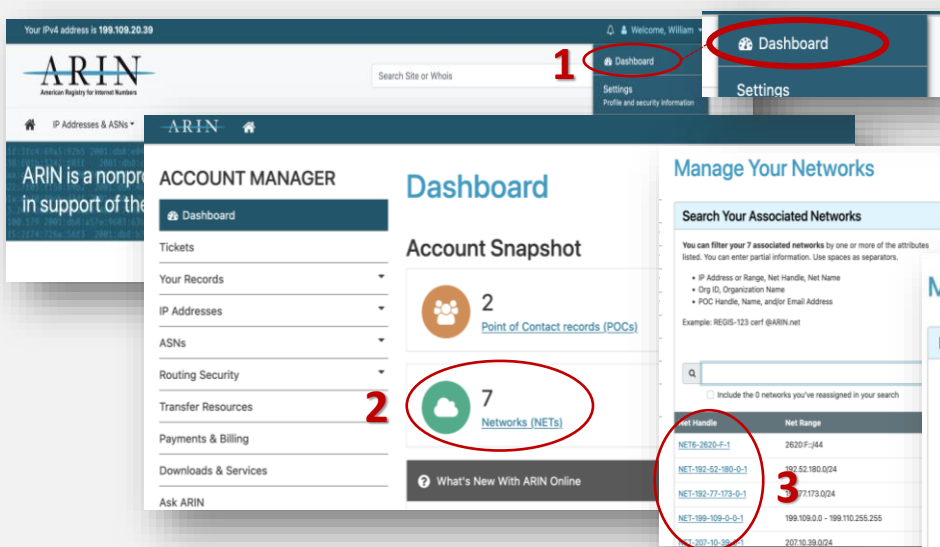


ARIN Agreement Fee Changes For Legacy Resources

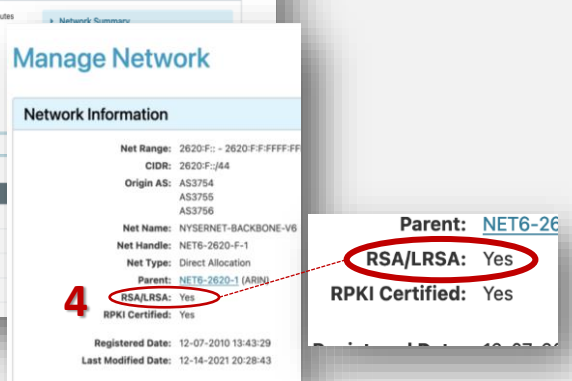


Before the American Registry for Internet Numbers (ARIN) existed, institutions were allocated IP addresses without an ARIN agreement. Today, ARIN offers basic services for free, but requires an agreement and annual fee for advanced offerings like routing security. Legacy resource holders currently pay discounted fees; however, if you don't have a Legacy RSA (LRSA) in place by the end of 2023 you will be subject to the much higher standard fee schedule.

HOW TO CHECK LRSA STATUS



1. Log in to the ARIN website at <https://www.arin.net>
2. Select **Dashboard**
3. Select **Networks (NETs)**
4. Select **Net Handle** link
5. Review **RSA/LRSA** status
